

Leverage Sustainable SUD Funding in Connecticut With Opioid Settlement Fund

Opioid Settlement Fund Offers Opportunity to Secure Sustainable Funding for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment

Healthcare organizations in Connecticut can now access additional behavioral healthcare funding as part of the Opioid Settlement Fund administered by the Connecticut Opioid Settlement Advisory Committee (OSAC), <https://portal.ct.gov/dmhas/newseworthy/news-items/ct-opioid-settlement-advisory-committee>.

Here's how:

1. **Local Share:** Determined by local municipality officials but must report uses to the OSAC.
2. **Opioid Settlement Fund:** OSAC accepts recommendations from stakeholders and subcommittees to inform expenditures. OSAC approved expenditures are dispersed by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services. Funding recommendations must include a 500-word description (approximate) along with an annualized budget to OSAC@ct.gov for consideration by the OSAC Referral Subcommittee and/or the appropriate Alcohol and Drug Policy Council subcommittee. If deemed appropriate, the recommendation is vetted and voted on by the OSAC. If approved by OSAC, the recommendation may result in an RFP, at which time the submitter can apply for funding
