Opioid Settlement Fund Offers Opportunity to Secure Sustainable Funding for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment

Healthcare organizations in Nevada can now access additional behavioral healthcare funding as part of the Opioid Settlement Fund administered by Nevada Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Director's Office, [Fund for a Resilient Nevada Dashboard](#).

Here's how:

1. **State Share:** DHHS creates a spending plan for fund allocation in consultation with the Office of Minority Health and Equity based on a needs assessment and recommendations from the Advisory Committee for a Resilient Nevada. Applicants can apply for grants via FRN Notices of Funding Opportunities, <https://nvopioidcoe.org/news/frn-notice-of-funding-opportunity/>.
2. **Local Share:** Determined by local county and city officials.

Special Notes

100% of State Share is allocated to the Fund for a Resilient Nevada (FRN).

Local Share is 38.77% to Local Governments plus 17.37% Medicaid Match Allocation for counties. The Medicaid Allocation is: 65% to Clark County, 14% to Washoe County, and 21% to the remaining counties (including non-litigating ones) based on population.
